

## Book Report/Book Talk

Your project requires the following criteria :

### 1. Visual aspect

You will need to have a visual support to catch your audience's attention while you are presenting to the class. For example: book cover, poster, sculpture, object, outfit/costume

### 2. Summary

You will need to present a summary of the book to your class. In your summary, you will explain important events and main characters. Alternatively, you may present your summary as a "movie trailer" to try to convince your peers to read it. You could also share your favourite character

### 3. Quote

You will need to share an excerpt from the book that you are reading and explain why it is important. It could be something that you have a connection with, a powerful part, an excerpt that reveals something about a character or the story, etc.

### 4. Rating (/5 stars)

You will give the book a rating out of 5 stars and explain your rating. What was good about the book? What could have been done better or differently? To whom would you recommend this book?

### 5. Plot diagram (for Mme only)

You will need to outline the key events in the book that you read on a plot diagram.
