2. You will apply your understanding of idioms to create an example of your chosen idiom to illustrate your understanding of the figurative meaning of the expression.

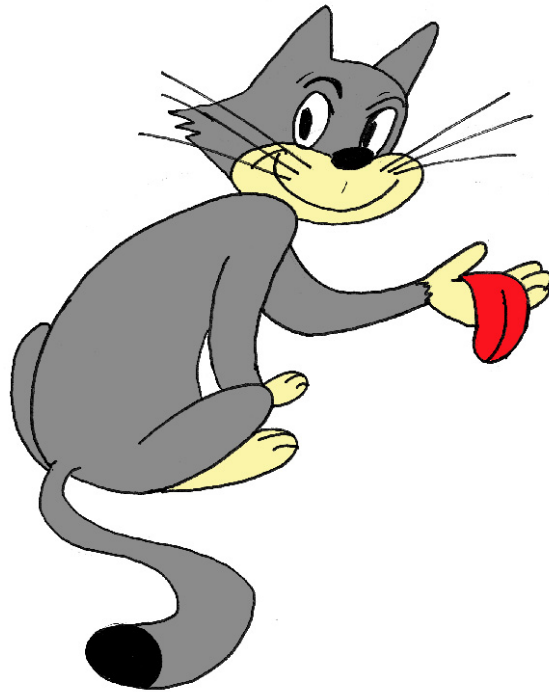
Criteria
